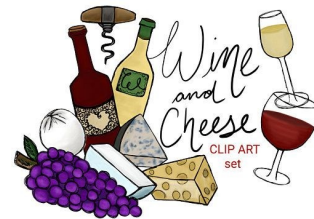

Philanthropic

We are very proud to present the following organizations as nominees to receive our annual charitable donations.

The Lifeboat Project Inc, Apopka - \$2,000

The mission of The Lifeboat Project is to raise awareness of the issue of human trafficking and to empower the lives of survivors through long-term aftercare, residential programs, trauma counseling, housing, personal development, and educational resources.

Samaritan Resource Center, Orlando - \$2,000

The Mission of the Samaritan Resource Center (SRC) is to break the cycle of homelessness and poverty by meeting the physical and spiritual needs of the homeless and other at-risk folks.

Since we began operating at our Colonial Drive center in 2013 we have helped 2,000 homeless individuals by providing assistance through applying for food stamps, SSI/SSD, Assurance phones; through partnerships with Goodwill's Job Connection Center, and with Lakeside Behavioral Center/Aspire; and through offering haircuts, clothing, prayer, and much more!

Special Hearts Farm, Winter Garden. - \$2,000

The Special Hearts Farm "Special Animals for Special Hearts," is a Non Profit 501(c) 3 organization and serves individuals with disabilities and unique abilities by providing adult day training, supported employment, and possible entrepreneur business opportunities related to farming and gardening experiences.

The Special Hearts Farm is located in Winter Garden, Florida. A collaboration between Orange County Public Schools and the Special Hearts Farm (501c3), has created and features a "true transition opportunity" for students with disabilities to train and continue performing meaningful jobs once they age out of school. This transition opportunity is the first of its kind in the state of Florida!

The Special Hearts Farm provides business opportunities for individuals with disabilities and unique abilities by producing and selling products such as goat milk soap, rustic signs, and hosting farm events and goat yoga. Our goal for the Special Hearts Farm is to promote health, happiness, and opportunity for individuals with disabilities and unique abilities within the West Orange Community.
